Where quality care meets cultural sensitivity

In recent years, the diversity of the South Bay has been greatly enriched by an expanding Chinese community. In an effort to better serve this fast-growing part of our patient base, we have identified two critical needs:

- Address health risks and disparities within the Chinese population proactively through screenings and health education
- Meet the cultural preferences and expectations of the Chinese population, as they relate to medical care

As part of El Camino Hospital's commitment to doing whatever it takes to meet our community's changing needs, we have launched the Chinese Health Initiative (CHI). The focus of this initiative is to raise awareness of health issues that occur with high incidence in the Chinese community, including hepatitis B, hypertension, liver cancer (often associated with chronic hepatitis), and lung cancer.

Education and screening

In collaboration with El Camino Hospital's Stroke Center, Women's Hospital, and Cancer Center, the Chinese Health Initiative provides screenings for hepatitis B, hypertension, stroke risk, breast and prostate cancers, and other conditions. We reach out to the Chinese community and provide educational information at key events. We also invite Chinese-speaking physicians from our CHI Physician Referral Network to present workshops on topics of interest to the Chinese community.

Culturally sensitive patient experience

One of the most important goals of the Chinese Health Initiative is to ensure a culturally appropriate patient experience for our Chinese patients. El Camino Hospital currently provides phone translation for Chinese callers. To help patients who are hospitalized feel more at home, we offer comfort food choices, for example rice porridge for breakfast.

One critical aspect of cultural sensitivity that has traditionally been overlooked is end-of-life care. We have forged a collaboration with the Chinese American Coalition for Compassionate Care, so as to best provide culturally sensitive end-of-life care for Chinese patients.

Chinese-speaking Physician Referral Network

In response to requests from our advisory board, physicians, patients, and the community at large, we have assembled a referral network of Chinese-speaking physicians. The physicians in the network are invited to join the CHI speakers bureau to present talks for the Chinese community. Our network includes both primary care and specialists, all of whom are committed to treating, educating, and working with the Chinese community. Continuing medical education

CHI has launched a Continuing Medical Education (CME) program for medical professionals to address the unmet health care needs and culturally appropriate medical care of the Chinese community.

Advisory board

El Camino Hospital has assembled a CHI Advisory Board comprised of Chinese community leaders, physicians, and El Camino Hospital staff. The Advisory Board includes three sub-committees: Clinical Programs, Outreach/Marketing, and Patient Experience Programs.
